THE LANE COLLECTION FACTS AND FIGURES

The May 2012 gift of photographs, works on paper, and paintings from the Lane Collection significantly enhances the MFA's holdings of 20th-century American art. The following outlines the 2012 gift from Saundra Lane as well as works previously given to the Museum by William and Saundra Lane:

May 2012 Gift

Approximately 6000 photographs (which have been on long-term loan to the MFA), transforming the Museum's collection and increasing the number of works in its photography holdings from 9,000 to 15,000. Highlights include:

- 2,500 by Edward Weston
- Almost 2,500 by Charles Sheeler
- 500 by Ansel Adams
- 100 by Brett Weston
- 100 by Imogen Cunningham
- 70 by Wynn Bullock
- More than 500 photographs acquired by Mrs. Lane since 1995, ranging from early 19th-century paper-and-glass-plate negative photography, turn-of-thecentury Pictorialism, and modernist images (both American and European), to experimental abstraction and contemporary works

100 works on paper, including:
